elcome to the 2018 PSRM 24th Annual Convention: Concerns, Controversies and Challenges in Reproductive Medicine. We have Professor Ramon Aurell Ballesteros from Spain, Dr. Michael Richardson, Professor Thiam Chye Tan and Ms. Angela Ho all from Singapore, Dr. Shubhadeep Bhattacharjee from India and Dr. Double Hong from Taiwan. These experts are not only well known in their respective fields, they are also driven by their willingness to teach.

In addition to the standard topics for discussion, we are including a session on fertility preservation and oncofertility, which serves to guide clinicians in addressing delicate matters with regards to this issue. Another highlight of the congress is the session exploring the role of the gynecologist in co-managing cancer patients. The aim of this session is to offer practitioners a practical approach to dealing with the gynecologic problems of cancer patients, given the limits of therapy. A third highlight is the

WELCOME DELEGATES!24th ANNUAL CONVENTION

The Philippine Society for Reproductive Medicine will hold it's 24th Annual Convention on September 25-27, 2018 entitled Concerns, Controversies and Challenges in Reproductive Medicine. The event, which will be held at Edsa Shangri



-la Hotel, will kick off with a Pre-congress IVF Course which aims to update IVF practitioners and embryologists with the different aspects of managing patients and the laboratory. There will be a breakout session in the afternoon wherein learnings acquired during the lectures would be applied. The main congress will tackle a diverse array of topics by excellent speakers. Topics included are endometriosis, polycystic ovary syndrome, contraception, menopause, infertility and fertility

panel discussion on menopause, where well-known experts will help the participants deal with various cases of women with menopause.

A new feature introduced in this congress is the Breakout Sessions, which will offer a more interactive type of learning. For this activity, the delegates will be choose a topic of interest, such as Adenomyosis, Leiomyoma, Pediatric and Adolescent Gynecology and Male Infertility. Authorities in the field will facilitate the teaching process. Apart from the usual didactics, the smaller group setting will allow the participants a more in-depth participation and learning.

This year, we have a special pre-congress course on In-Vitro Fertilization. It will tackle the basics of IVF and how to apply them to actual clinical IVF practice. It will also showcase different scenarios encountered during IVF, its complications and updates. A special feature of this course is the focused group discussion. The delegates will be divided into smaller groups where an IVF expert will mentor them in a classroomtype setting. This session will help the delegates apply their learnings from the day's didactics to actual IVF cases. The idea is to simulate the daily approach to the management (stimulation and monitoring) of IVF patients. This course is dedicated to all specialists (REIs, embryologists, IVF lab staff) looking to further advance their knowledge on IVF as well as OB-GYNs interested in understanding more about IVF. Joining us for this workshop are our international guests, Prof. Ramon Aurell Ballesteros, Dr. Michael Richardson, Ms. Angela Ho, Dr. Shubhadeep Bhattacharjee and Dr. Double Hong.

We are also continuing a feature which we introduced last year: the distribution of a handbook on reproductive medicine. This is a compact reference manual, compiling the various classifications/tables that we use in our practice of reproductive medicine. This is a handy and useful material for our clinics and each attendee will be provided with a revised and updated free copy of the guidebook.

In order to boost the research output of residents, fellows, consultants in Reproductive Medicine, we will also have a Research and Interesting Case Contest on September 26. The Research Committee spearheaded by Dr. Angela Aguilar has seen a rise in the number of submissions. There will also be a gallery featuring the poster sessions of all accepted entries.

ALL delegates are invited to participate in the annual fellowship night on September 26. This year's theme is the luauinspired "ARTLOHA", and all attendees are invited to come in their best hawaiian outfit. Our Socials Committee, headed by Dr. Ney Abat, has prepared games and surprise numbers for everyone to participate and enjoy. EDITOR'S CORNER

STIMULATING RESEARCH AND ITS RELEVANCE IN OUR DAILY PRACTICE

Many of us are clinicians. We barely have enough extra time for other endeavors apart from our surgeries and our clinics. Even our family and friends have to compete for our attention—what more for an obscure entity called research?

Yet we have, even in our daily practice, questions that need to be answered, patients' needs that have to be fulfilled, diagnostic dilemmas that have to be deciphered and management controversies that have to be resolved. Who will give these answers? Where will we get enlightenment? What will provided solutions?

Research. Written and published—these will give us answers to our clinical questions. Whether it is a mere storytelling exercise—the case report—or a full blown randomized, double blind, placebo controlled, multicenter study—the whole range contributes to the body of scientific knowledge.

The case report is more than just gossip of what the other doctor encountered in her clinic. The case report helps us compare similar clinical profiles, heighten our diagnostic suspicions, and guide us to possible treatments and prepare us for probable outcomes. Case reports in greater numbers (hopefully, with adequate sample sizes) become clinical studies, whose outcomes can be generalized to a larger number of patients. These can direct us toward better approaches to our patient's diagnosis and management. Research can, to quote David Shaw and Gareth Jones in their paper written in the last century, fill "the most pressing gaps in our knowledge."

This year, we have endeavored to expand the participation to this communal building of scientific knowledge. We have expanded our invitation to include not just REI fellows but also to all who will con-

duct any study covering topics pertinent to reproductive medicine:

- 1. Infertility
- 2. Polycystic ovary syndrome
- 3. Endometriosis
- 4. Myoma
- 5. Abnormal uterine bleeding
- 6. Recurrent pregnancy loss
- 7. Disorders of sexual development
- 8. Reproductive genetics
- 9. Menopause
- 10. Contraception

We envision that our annual meeting will be a forum, not just for lectures by eminent speakers, but also a forum to exchange of ideas, a setting for collaboration, a venue for translating data into clinical recommendations, a catalyst to change practice and create a positive impact on reproductive health. We hope that from this fertile ground will rise reproductive scientists from among us who will lead the charge and push the agenda of research and innovation in reproductive medicine.

Let us all get involved. Let us all get engaged. Research!
