### Regulating infertility practice

In recent years, the emergence of clinical practice guidelines, evidence-based medicine, and ethics-based management has provided a clearer pathway on how certain fields of medicine should be practiced. The



general idea was and is to protect the general interest of patients by making clinicians conform to a minimum standard of medical care.

Infertility practice is one of such medical fields. For many years, the practice of infertility in the country treaded unsure ground as management principles were evolving based on available research in the international and local arena. With the improvement of knowledge and skill through continuing medical education AND experience, interest in the subspecialty has dramatically grown recently. Coupled with increased practice, of course, are complications and/or failures.

The regulation of certain infertility procedures such as *intrauterine insemination* and *in vitro fertilization* will surely be welcome by the general public. Many rely on the precept that all doctors are capable of delivering the highest quality of care required to allow the lowest possibility of complications and/or failure. With the regulation of medical standards, all concerned doctors will be compelled to seek proper training prior to his practice of certain procedures. This way, the public will be assured of a minimum acceptable level of competence.

Dr. Santiago del Rosario already has a stellar record that few can match-past POGS president (1984), past PMA president (1988-89), present PSCM vice president (2005), a distinguished record in government service (1988-89, 1997), and a past or active member of at least 20 professional local and international groups of varying causes. Still, he continues to be attracted to the opportunity to be of service in disciplines which may in turn provide opportunities to improve healthcare especially in the community.

He fondly recalls hid days when, as PMA president, many new perspectives in life were opened, things which were to him not clearly in focus.
