### What's NEW in the care of the Menopausal Woman?

Menopause period occupies more than one third of the life of an average woman who lives up till 80 presently. Health care for these women is a big burden to families and our society. Presently, attention has been focused on the cardiovascular health being the number one cause of morbidity and mortality in the world. Thus, the International Menopause Society (IMS) with its knowledgeable members have met several times to come up with important statements regarding cardiovascular health.

Weight gain occurs in peri-menopausal women not receiving HRT. This is mainly due to an increase in body fat, which is concentrated in the abdomen. An increased BMI tends to reduce insulin sensitivity and increase systolic BP. This is accompanied by decline in serum HDL cholesterol levels and increase in LDL cholesterol which all contributes to higher incidence of CHD.

Hypertension, dyslipidemia, obesity and other components of the metabolic syndrome are now preventable. The recommendation of the IMS that HRT can be given to women around the age of natural menopause without increasing the risk of coronary heart disease and may even decrease the risk in this age group. HRT is not contraindicated in women with hypertension as it may even reduce blood pressure. This period is the window of opportunity to reduce the risk of CVD morbidity and mortality for those with vasomotor symptoms. It should be said that postmenopausal women are not recommended to take HRT for solely the prevention of CVD. HRT is contraindicated in women with a history of myocardial infarction, stroke, or pulmonary embolism.

Recommendation of lifestyle modifications should be stressed as diabetes mellitus, elevated triglycerides, smoking and hypertension could be reversed. Proper control with agents that have been accepted should be prescribed by the menopausal physician along with advice of regular exercises.

Regular evaluation of all parameters of good health should be undertaken. Specific recommendations on the duration of HRT should be based on the patient characteristics and the dose and type of HRT used. After the WHI publication, the IMS executive committee stated that there are no reasons to place mandatory limitations on the length of therapy. It was considered that there was no justification for the arbitrary cessation in women who started HRT during the menopausal transition and remain symptom-free while on hormones.

### **Infertility Practice in Southern Mindanao Region**

It has been a real pleasure to be asked to write regarding the practise of infertility in Southern Mindanao region. Let me categorize my response in three aspects: knowledge, economic and culture.

Having been into the practice for the past 3 years, I could say that the general public has recognized and gradually gained acceptance to the existence of infertility as a real problem in the journey to parenthood. Setting the Fertility Care Center — Davao, Inc. (FCCDI), a Brokenshire Hospital based facility located in the heart of the city, with the rest of OB-Gyn practitioners to address the need of the subfertile individual in the region was a brilliant decision. It is designed as "one stop shop" that will enable subfertile individual to gain access to the current technology. Annually the statistic of couples seeking consultation has risen by a quarter. Many of whom were amazed by the fact when they come to realize that time is of the essence in the management of fertility.

A series of layman's forum have been made for the past years which we usually hold during the center's anniversary. Worth mentioning is the last layman's forum with topic on male infertility. Mindanao is the home of almost 30 percent of the Filipino sea farers which by occupation and chronic absentee has made them very likely to experience secondary infertility if not primary. Of course working hand-in-hand with the urologist has always been beneficial to both our practise and patient.

Cost of the treatment has been the major deterrent to pursue fertility treatment. Proven helpful is socializing the service by offering "packages" especially on endoscopic procedures.

Correcting fallacies is very challenging which usually transpires during the initial visit of the couple. On a personal note, it takes so much courage for a young practitioner to counsel with conviction on patients who are more often a decade or more older my age.

The journey has just started ..... more updates next issue.
